Since 2019, he has been Secretary of the Regional Unit of Municipalities of Central Macedonia. He was also Vice Mayor for Culture in the Municipality of Thessaloniki (2006-2010), Vice President of the Board of Directors of the Municipal Television-Radio of Thessaloniki, president of the Board of Directors of Thessaloniki State Symphony Orchestra (2005-2011), Vice president of the Board of Directors of the Macedonian Museum of Contemporary Art (2006-2010) and President of the Board of Directors of the Hellenic Chamber of Commerce-Department of Central Macedonia (2004-2007).

In 2009, he was named chevalier (Cavaliere) by the President of the Italian Republic and he has also received numerous awards and honors by associations and institutions.
